Make plans to join Epworth's Alumni Association for Cook-Out for Kids April 17, 2010 on the Epworth Campus in Columbia.



Epworth Basketball

Every year as the school year begins I start to get questions like, "Mr. Parker, when does basketball start?" Our kids love to play basketball and thanks to a local church league and the United Methodist Basketball Tournament, they have a great opportunity to experience what basketball is all about.

This year we have 36 children playing on three teams in the Christian youth basketball league. Brad Gray, a United Methodist Minister at Greene St. UMC, coaches our boys team with assistant coach Forrest Dutton. Epworth Pastor Megan Gray assists me with coaching two girls' teams.

Many of our children have never participated in team sports. This year was the first time 12 of our kids had ever played basketball. One girl told me she always wanted to play so she decided to give it a try. She was one of the leaders on our 7th-9th grade girls team before falling and breaking her wrist during a game. She still comes to practice and will dribble and practice shooting with her healthy hand and always has a smile on her face.

Our boys are off to a really good start, as they are 7-0 in the regular season and our older girls have won their last three games despite a slow start. The younger girls have a 3-3-1 record and have made huge progress with learning the game.

Our teams did really well this year and participated in the United Methodist Basketball Tournament held January 29-31. Our kids loved this opportunity because it was out of town and we got to stay in a hotel room. During the tournament we attended the worship service at Ashley Ridge UMC and took communion at Bethany UMC in Summerville. This was a trip our children will always remember. We are excited to see what God is doing and will do in the lives of the youth at Epworth.

News from the Learning Center...

In an era of increased dependency on computers and technology, our residents are learning the importance of becoming "computer literate." The middle and high school students increasingly face school assignments and projects requiring them to use computers and technology. Those requirements, along with the realization that many companies are moving to more web-based programs for recruitment and hiring, make it crucial for our residents to become comfortable using a computer and the Internet. Through a series of computer based lessons, Barnes Learning Center helps our residents gain knowledge and develop practical skills that will benefit them both in and out of school.

With the addition of a certified business education teacher to our after-school tutorial staff, we will provide our residents the opportunity to build skills both in computer based applications as well as business related content. Beginning in February, we will offer weekly sessions focusing on "What can you do with Microsoft Office 2007?" These sessions will help our middle and high school students become more familiar with the basic components of a computer as well as allow them to become proficient in keyboarding and the Microsoft Office programs Word, Excel and PowerPoint. In the near future, we also plan to offer weekly sessions which will focus on transitional preparation. Students will participate in lessons aimed at helping them identify potential career interests, preparing for job interviews, and understanding the importance of time management and budgeting.

With the addition of these classes to our academic program, we believe our students will move one step closer to becoming successful and responsible adults.
