

boys team made another shot late in the game at the annual South Carolina United Methodist Tournament in North Augusta.


"Timeout! Timeout!" said the opposing coach.

A Message from The Rev. John Holler President

In the year of 1895, the Methodist people of South Carolina authorized the founding of Epworth Orphanage in order to provide a Christian home for children who needed a place to live. Since that time, the children who reside at Epworth continue to receive generous support through church congregations in our state.

While Epworth does not receive financial support from the Denomination and is not an apportioned item that receives financial support from the South Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church, Epworth does receive contributions from the majority of United Methodist congregations in South Carolina.

Two Sundays, Mother's Day in May and Work Day in September, are designated as Epworth Children's Home Sundays on which pastors are asked to highlight God's work through Epworth and receive a special offering for the support of the children of Epworth.

During the calendar year of 2013, \$1,477,333.60 was received from and or credited to the 1,007 United Methodist congregations in South Carolina. This total does not include "in kind" or volunteer work.

I am pleased to announce that the per member giving reached \$6.27 this past year, which means the goal of an average gift of at least \$6.00 per United Methodist in S.C. was achieved. 2013 church giving reports reflect the following for S.C. United Methodists.

United Methodist in S.C. – 235,489

Average giving per member - \$6.27 (an increase of \$0.09 per member)

Number of United Methodist Churches - 1,007

Number of congregations contributing at \$6 per member or greater – 340 (an increase of 19)

Number of congregations contributing \$0.00 – 213 (a decrease of 26)

Number of charges ordering Epworth offering materials – 431

On behalf of the staff and the children who live at Epworth, I thank everyone who has given and worked so diligently to reach this level of support. As we all see, this level of congregational support is crucial in providing the best possible care for our children.

Denominational support goals for 2013 are:


- an average of at least \$6.00 per member from every United Methodist in S.C.;
- every congregation contributing at least \$6.00 per member;
- no "zero" congregations;
- and every congregation observing Mother's Day and Work Day by receiving an offering for Epworth's Children.

Total giving increased by \$102,887 in 2013. \$22,000 of the amount was credited to congregational giving. We celebrate the increase in congregational support, and know the best days are yet ahead for the children and families of Epworth.


2013 Revenue Sources Total Revenue \$5,235,345

For just a moment everyone in the stands fell silent. Stunned at what they were seeing.

Bobby snatched the ball and launched a shot but it fell short. Jamal reached up and caught the ball in the air. He turned around and "accidently" dropped the ball right into Bobby's hands again. Bobby grabbed the ball put up a shot and... swish...the ball dropped right through the basket!

The crowd went wild as the stands and players erupted with cheers. Suddenly the scoreboard seemed completely irrelevant.



In addition to the junior boys, the Epworth Memorial Senior Girls team also brought home a trophy to campus. The girls received the tournament's Milford Sportsmanship Award.

Jamal grabbed the ball and passed it to his teammate, Kevin. Kevin also "lost the ball" and it bounced directly to Bobby who immediately put up another shot. Swish…he scored another basket.

The crowd was now moved to tears, as were the Epworth coaches. The secret play the boys had scripted during the last timeout was not about the Epworth team at all, it was about giving Bobby the opportunity to score.

The scene played out one more time and then the final buzzer sounded. Bobby ran around the gym in pure joy with his teammates.

Coach Parsons wiped away the tears from his eyes and turned around when a lady tapped him on his shoulder. The lady was sobbing and tears poured down on her cheeks. She composed herself and said, "Coach, I'm Bobby's mother. That was the first time Bobby has ever scored a basket. He is going to remember this moment forever. We all will."

For many of the children at Epworth, the campus basketball team is the first time they have played organized sports. The basketball court is a place where they learn valuable lessons and enjoy the feeling of being a part of something bigger. This year's junior boy's team, all of whom came to Epworth from a series of tragic situations, came together and gave Bobby the opportunity of a lifetime. Epworth strives to provide many and various "opportunities of a lifetime" for our residents, and during this game it was evident that our residents are following in our footsteps.

Our boys went on to win the tournament championship that weekend, bringing another trophy home to the Epworth gymnasium. But as Coach Parsons eloquently stated when they returned to campus, "I'm proud of the championship, but our great moment was when our players saw a need and provided for Bobby and his parents. I'm so proud of my boys."
