Intensive In-Home Services[†]

Epworth's Intensive In-Home Services (IIHS) is a 4-6 month program which provides an array of services and support to families who are involved with the SC Department of Social Services (SCDSS). IIHS works with families throughout four stages of service intensity in effort to increase effective parenting, communication and coping skills through in-home counseling and additional behavioral health services.

The Family Care Center

The Family Care Center is a unique program for mothers with substance abuse difficulties and their children. The family lives together at Epworth while the mother receives addiction treatment. Epworth teaches parenting skills while providing care for the children and nurturing family bonds.

Circle of Parents®+

Epworth is the state partner to Circle of Parents®, a national organization that provides training and technical support for the development of parent-driven support groups with a parallel children's program called Children's Circle. These parent groups are peer led, mutual self-help groups for all parents.

HOMEBUILDERS®[†]

HOMEBUILDERS® provides 4-6 weeks of intensive, in-home crisis intervention, counseling and lifeskills education for families with children from birth to age 18 who are at imminent risk of placement in state-funded care. The goal of HOMEBUILDERS® is to prevent the unnecessary out-of-home placement of children through intensive, on-site intervention, and to teach families new problemsolving skills to prevent future crises.
